

If you or someone you know currently resides in California and has been granted asylum by the United States or is in the process of seeking asylum, the ESAVN program can provide you with case management services.

ESAVN will provide culturally appropriate and responsive case management services for asylees and vulnerable noncitizens for up to 90 days within the first year following the grant of asylum, or after they have been deemed a vulnerable noncitizen eligible for services.



Eligible Populations

- Individuals granted asylum
- Noncitizen survivors of human trafficking, domestic violence, and other serious crimes who are preparing to file or have filed petitions for the T-Visa, or have filed petitions for or received the U-Visa non-immigrant status with the appropriate federal agency
